



Teaching notes

Pages 1 and 2 of this resource should be stuck together to create a board game. Students will need a counter each and a dice for each group.

How to play:

Students should play in groups of 2-4. They should take turns to throw the dice and move around the board. When they land on a square they should add any missing details/dates, and move forward or back as directed. Their turn then ends and they should explain why the event they landed on helped OR hindered Hitler and the Nazis.

Ideally students should play at least twice.
